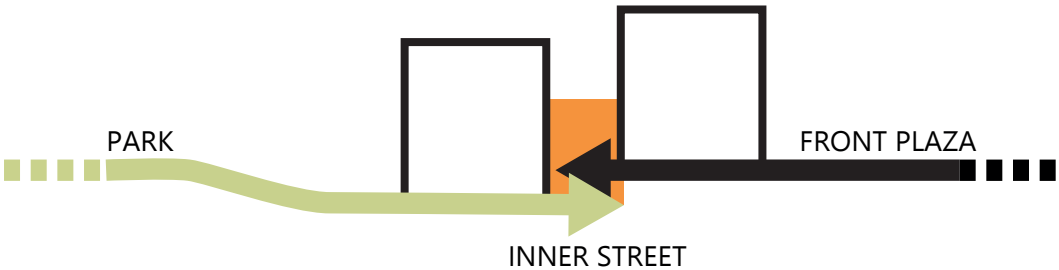


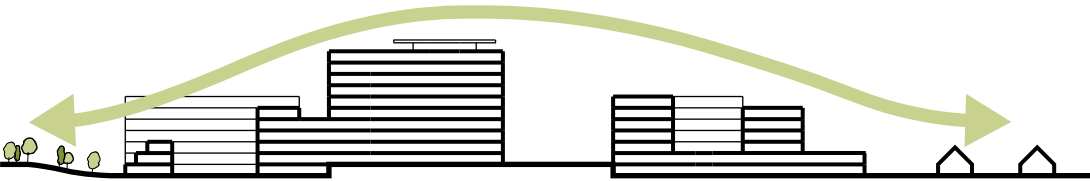
From uniform “Health Machine” to a varied, urban appearance:
Replacing the 1970’s high-rise block with a human-scaled, city-like silhouette



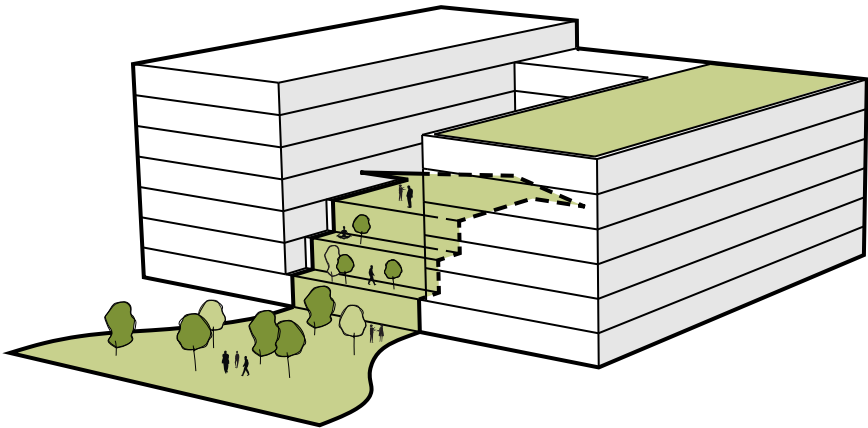
A new inner street interlaced with green landscape:
Re-organizing the inner logistics through a new thoroughfare connecting all medical functions and providing an exciting spatial sequence with views and access to the central green park



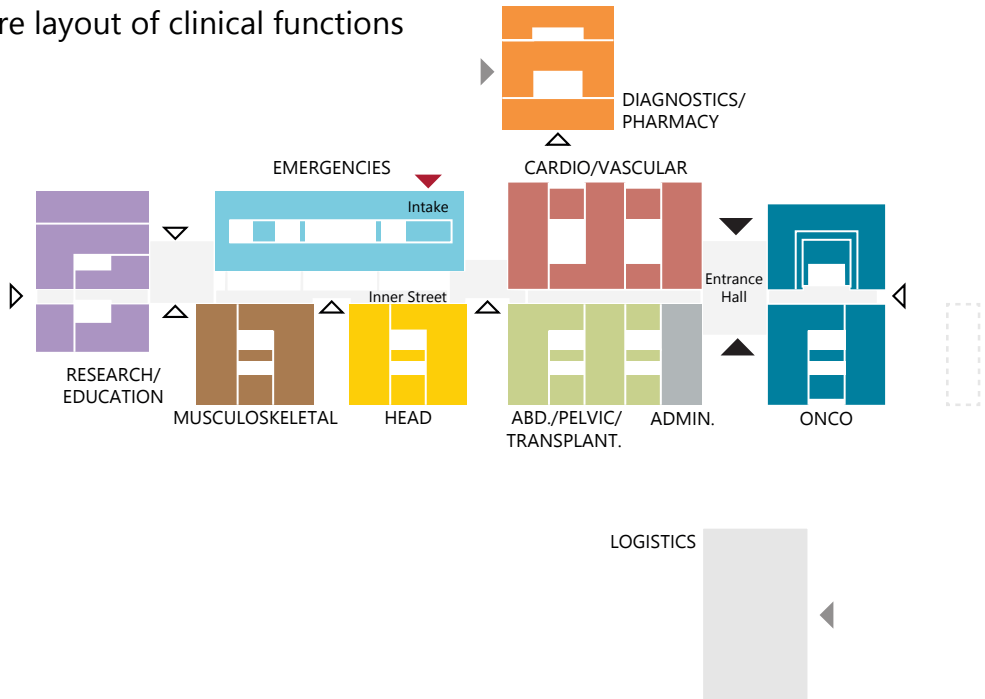
Adapting the urban silhouette to the context:
