1 There is an information board at Cardwell Bay. What year was Fort Matilda station build according to this board?

2 Next to this board, there is an old water fountain at Cardwell Bay. It has animals faces on it. What is the animal and how many faces are there?

3 There is a brown sign as you cycle through Battery Park for Lyle Hill. What large white sculpture stands at the top of Lyle Hill. Feel free to use Google if you don't know the answer.

4 Overlooking the water in Battery Park there is stone sculpture with a metal map on the top. Can you name one of the Lochs marked on there?

5 There is a bench in Battery Park overlooking the water which says "Wings and floats, wings and feet" – this describes a mammal – what is the mammal?

Head now in the direction of Greenock towards the Esplanade

6 As you join the Esplanade you pass the RWSABC (Royal West of Scotland Amateur Boat Club) – their logo has a red badge with what colour cross in it?

7 As you cycle along the Esplanade keep your eye peeled across the road on the right. There will be some interesting stonework on the opposite site of the road. Take care when you cross here. This is a stone fountain. What name is at the top of this fountain?

8 Continue along the Esplanade and you pass a large metal buoy which is black, white and red. There is an inscription on it. What Trust left the inscription?

9 As you continue along the Esplanade you will see two large blue cranes in the distance. What is written on these cranes?

10 What is the name of the Church at the end of the Esplanade?

11 At the end of the Esplanade there is a sign giving distances by bike. How far is it to Port Glasgow?
